



Learning Project - My Family

Age Range- Year 3 and Year 4

Weekly Maths Tasks (aim to do one a day)	Weekly Reading Task (aim to do one a day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working on Times Table Rockstars - your child will have an individual login to access this (20 mins on SOUND CHECK). • Practice maths skills on Prodigy. • Play on Hit the Button - focus on division facts. • Practice telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes. • Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything they know about Subtraction. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be. • Practice counting forwards and backwards from any given number in 2s. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation. • Listen to a story read, Storytime. • Watch Newsround and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Is there anything you need help understanding? • Get your child to read a book on Oxford Owl, discuss what your child enjoyed about the book. • Complete a book review on one of the books you have read - what did you like about it? Would you recommend it to anyone? • Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?
Weekly Phonics/Spelling Tasks (aim to do one a day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practice the Year 3/4 for Common Exception words. • Practise your spelling on Spelling Shed. • Practise your spelling on Spelling Frame. • Practice spellings on Top Marks. • Can you write 3 letters that are Vowels? • Can you write 3 letters that are consonants? • Write 10 words on a piece of paper. Spell 5 of the words incorrectly and let your child 'mark' you work. Can they spot which spellings are correct and which are incorrect. Can they write the incorrect words correctly? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a recount of your day. This could be used in history one day to show what happened during this period. • Write a character description of a member of their family. What do they look like? How do they behave? etc... • Write a story involving members of their family. Do they have to defeat a monster? or find something they have lost? • Write a fact file about yourself. What do you look like? What are your likes and dislikes? • Follow poetry4kids how to write funny poems chapter 2. See if you can write your own rhyming poem.

Learning Projects (to be done throughout the week)

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of their own family. Learning may focus on what different makeup of families, what traditions your family has, stories linked to your family etc.

- Time to Talk: Perhaps they could play a board game, facetime a member of their family they have not seen this week, enjoy a family indoor picnic or have a family dinner.
- Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences: Discuss how their family is different to other people's families. Discuss whether all families are the same? Does it matter? Do all families have the same faith? Do all families worship in the same way?
- Reflect: Find out what music their family members enjoy. Do they like the same music? What is their favourite song? They could listen to different pieces of music together with their family. Do they like/dislike any particular types of music and why? Can they identify the instruments they can hear and describe how the music makes them feel? Why not get them to listen to some of the classics?
- Be Active: [Go Noodle](#) with the family or have a family workout. Maybe try some yoga with your family. Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.
